Re: Riverside Village Agreement

Dear Mr. Evans:

This letter is followup to the meeting with you, Don Stockton and myself in your office on December 7, 1992 regarding your plans to complete Riverside Village's obligations as required by the November 10, 1980 agreement between the State of Idaho and Riverside Group.

* We understand that it is your contention that Idaho Forest Industries, Inc. (IFI) has no obligation to fulfill this agreement or to repair and resurface the deteriorated paved bike path segment that was constructed in the Fall of 1981 by IFI's predecessor in interest.

* However, it is the state's position that IFI is obligated to fulfill the agreement and specifically by Section 4 of the Agreement to complete construction of the paved bike path in accordance with the previously approved standards and specifications. The state's position was conveyed to you over a year ago in my letter of March 15, 1991 (copy attached).
